






### GRADE 4/5

They heard stories of the Inuit people of the Arctic and listened to the song "Northwest Passage" to get a feel for how cold and harsh the winters are. On Friday the class took a field trip to the Alaska Native Heritage Center to learn about the cultures and traditions of the native peoples of Alaska.









### **GRADE 8**

This week the 8th grade has been in the final week of our block title 'Our Unalienable Rights'. We have gone through the social movements, starting with the suffrage movement, and going through The Civil Rights Movement, Second Wave Feminism, the LGBTQ+ Rights movement of the 60s-80s, and finished off looking at current social movements. We have looked at things movements did well, and things they did not do as well. We have read speeches that were given, excerpts of books written, and as well as short stories. We have read constitutional amendments and talked about important supreme court cases over the years. As a main part of this block, each 8th grader has completed a research project on an activist which included a portrait, and an illustrated timeline.
