What is a Farm Share?

A Farm Share is a subscription to receive regular deliveries of farm fresh produce. Our fully customizable produce boxes take the planning out of buying local and ensure you get more of the Alaskan products you love. Plus, our add-on options of eggs, milk, meat, seafood and pantry staples allow you to do all your shopping in one place!

From July - early October Farm Shares will include 100% Alaskan produce. From mid-October - June, we'll have a mix of Alaskan and Washington products. Farm names and locations will be listed with each product, so you will always know where your food is coming from.

The children must take turns pulling one another around the play yard and this brings all sorts of great things into their play. How will we get each other up the hill? 


SUNFLOWER KINDERGARTEN
