




SUNFLOWER KINDERGARTEN


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


GRADE 1

GRADE 3/4




GRADE 5/6





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


"The Rope Stretchers"

The ancient Egyptions needed a way to measure their plots when the Mile River Flooded and the deposited sitt that covered their plot boundaries. In order to make their plots rectangular or Square shaped, they needed a tool to measure a right angle. The Egyptions discovered that they could use a knotted rape with equal spacing between the knots to make an accurate right triangle. This type of triangle is known as a 3-4-5 triangle between there are 3 knots on one side, 4 knots on another side, and 5 knots on the long side.
