












#### GRADE 4/5

#### GRADE 6/7





THE 4TH-5TH GRADE CLASS HAVE BEGUN THE SCHOOL YEAR BY LEARNING ABOUT HAND TOOLS AND BASIC WOODWORKING SAFETY. THEIR FIRST PROJECT WILL BE A WHISTLE CARVED OUT OF A PIECE OF BIRCH LIMB. THEY HAVE BEEN DRILLING HOLES WITH A HAND DRILL AND USING A KNIFE TO SCRAPE THE BARK OFF OF THE LIMB.



THE 6TH-7TH GRADE STUDENT BEGAN THE YEAR WITH A REVIEW OF MEASUREMENTS AND THE USE OF A RULER. THEIR FIRST PROJECT WILL BE A TIC-TAC-TOE BOARD. THE STUDENTS HAD TO LOCATE THE CENTER OF EACH SQUARE ON THE BOARD. HOLES WERE DRILLED IN THE BOARD. THE STUDENTS WILL CUT PIECES OF DOWEL FOR THE PEGS AND STAIN THE BOARD.

THE 8TH GRADE STUDENTS ARE
CONTINUING TO DEVELOP
CREATIVE SKILLS LEARNED
PREVIOUS YEARS. THEY ARE
GOING TO CARVE A DISH OUT OF
A SLAB OF BIRCH. THE STUDENTS
HAD TO REMOVE THE BARK AND
MARK THE CENTER OF THEIR
DISH. EACH SLAB IS DIFFERENT.
SO, EACH DISH WILL BECOME THE
INDIVIDUAL CREATIVITY OF THE
STUDENTS AS THEY CHISEL AND
GOUGE THE WOOD OUT OF THE
