LOST AND FOUND


OUR LOST IN FOUND IS ALREADY ACQUIRING ITEMS AT A STEADY PACE!

Honoring the importance of purposeful work and imaginative play is a cornerstone of Waldorf Early Childhood Education. We create an environment that supports the foundation of learning and cultivates a love of knowledge and exploration.









The sense of touch feeds their inner life experience and helps them understand and connect with the physical world. We support the kindergarten to develop a strong sense of touch by giving them opportunities to work with natural materials such as wool, silk, cotton, wood, pine cones & stones, which they then take into their play, work, and festival life. 




GRADE 6/7
