Heat, pressure, melting, and erosion! This week the students in Grade 5/6 learned about the rock cycle. We started the week learning about metamorphic rocks and how these rocks often have "swirls" in them created from heat and pressure bending the minerals in the rocks. The students loved creating "marbled" paper to represent these bends and folds. We also started growing our own stalactites after learning about these

rock "icicles" found in limestone caves. The highlight of the week was a field trip to visit the Matanuska Glacier which was an incredible experience since it was most of the students' first time visiting a glacier!
